Asbestos-related conditions

Pleural Plaques

Areas of scar tissue forming on the lining of the lungs (the pleura). Usually they do not carry any long term health problems.

Pleural Thickening

This is similar in appearance to pleural plaques, but the 'thickening' is more widespread and may involve both layers of the pleura. Diffuse pleural thickening can cause breathlessness and is considered to be more serious than pleural plaques.

Asbestosis

Most common disease associated with asbestos exposure. Many people think that asbestosis is a cancer but this is not the case. Asbestosis is also sometimes called "interstitial pulmonary fibrosis". Simply, this means the lung itself is damaged.

Asbestos-related Lung Cancer

Workers exposed to asbestos have an increased risk of developing lung cancer. This risk is greatly increased if the person exposed to asbestos also smokes.

Mesothelioma

A cancer of the lining of the lungs and can also be known as "malignant pleural mesothelioma". Can also affect the lining of the stomach (peritoneal mesothelioma).
